



CONVERSATION – WHERE DID YOU GO?/WHERE ARE YOU GOING?

Conversation 1: Where did you go today?

- (1) čad k^w(i) adsʔuχ^w ʔal ti sləχil.
'Where did you go today?'
- (2) ləʔuχ^w čəd tx̣əl _____.
'I went to _____.'

You can fill in the blank in (2) with a number of nouns, for example:
ləʔuχ^w čəd tx̣əl syayus.
'I went to work.'

Here are a number of words to use with (2):

| 2. syayusadiʔ | 'office' (literally, 'work room'.) |
| 3. syayusalʔtx̣w | 'office building' (literally, 'work house/building'.) |
| 4. x ^w uyubalʔtx̣w | 'store' ('sell house/building') |
| 5. ʔələdalʔtx̣w | 'restaurant' ('eating house/building') |
| 6. kupialʔtx̣w | 'coffee shop' ('coffee house/building') |
| 7. χalalʔtx̣w | 'school' ('writing house/building') |
| 8. siʔab ləšχayʔ χalalʔtx̣w | 'Chief Leschi School(s)' |
| 9. spuyaləp/puyaləp | 'Puyallup' |
| 10. d ^z id ^z əlalič | 'Seattle' |
| 11. g ^w ədilalʔtx̣w | 'bathroom' ('sit down house') |
| 12. kukcutalʔtx̣w | 'kitchen' ('cook house') |
| 13. piitalʔtx̣w | 'bedroom' ('bed house') |



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For saying, 'I went home', just say:

lət'uk'w čəd.

'I went home.'

Conversation 2: Where did you go yesterday?

(3) (a) čad k^w(i) adsʔuχ^w ʔal tə tul'əłdat. (SL)
'Where did you go yesterday?'

(b) čad k^w(i) adsʔuχ^w ʔal tə tuduk^wəłdat. (NL)
'Where did you go yesterday?'

'I went to _____.'

Conversation 3: Where did you go last weekend?

(5) čad k^w(i) adsʔuχ^w ʔal ti laqbidəłdat.
'Where did you go last weekend?'
